Overview of Season 2023-2024

Firstly, we must pay our respects to the bowls friends that we have lost this year – Kevin Smith, Alan Wilson. Some of our bowlers lost their loved ones as well. Our deepest sympathies are extended to their families and friends. A number of our bowlers were unwell or had medical treatment during the year and we supported them through these times.

We welcomed new coach Graeme Spencer into our club this season. Graeme has settled into Mulgrave very well and has been very productive with the Monday and Thursday training sessions. He was always on hand during the finals series to give advice and support to those participating.

Bill McHoul joined Mulgrave Club in July as the Sports Coordinator and Community Liaison Officer and oversees all of the sporting sections. Bill is very proactive in promoting Mulgrave Country Club as a sporting club and has many good ideas for the advancement of sports at the club.

We continue to be well represented in the competitive bowls arena.

At the end of the home and away pennant season Weekend Pennant achieved two section flags from Sides 2 and 4 with Side 4 going on to win the Division quarter final but unfortunately were defeated in the Division semifinal.

Midweek Pennant saw Side 5 winning their Section Final and the Division quarter final whilst Thursday Pennant Side 1 also won their Section Final.

The atmosphere at all of the finals was amazing with so many of our members attending the games to cheer their friends on. It certainly shows that the Mulgrave bowlers are proud to be part of this club.

A great effort from all bowlers and you all should be proud of your achievements. A big thanks to all Selection Committees for your hard work and dedication.

On the social side of bowls, we continue to receive good numbers on our weekly Wednesday competition throughout the year and all winter bowls. Our social bowls continue to conduct Social Happy Days and other challenge games.



The club championships have been progressing with the majority completed at the time of my report. Congratulations to all winners, runners-up and participants. This year the committee elected to award trophies to the winners of the club's singles and pairs championship with a small celebration afterwards. Again, all finals have been played in front of a large number of spectators which again adds to the camaraderie of the club.

The Bowls Section hosted a number of external events such as Eastern Ranges Bowls Championships, Pennant Finals, RSL events and the Vermont South Challenge. This coming May we will be hosting the Novice State Carnival over a period of 4 days.

A number of our bowlers represented the club at Region, Victorian and Australian Open events as well as playing in the BPL qualifiers. Our congratulations to Graeme Spencer on winning our Region's Men's Over 60 singles.

Corporate Bowls had another successful year with around 1,000 participants and we must thank Brian Milnes and his helpers for their continued support.

Barefoot Bowls ran through February and March on Friday evenings. This year the weather was very kind to us and we averaged over 60 bowlers each night. The kitchen was converted into a pop-up bar and sandwiches were provided. A BBQ was provided on the last evening headed by Barry Fleming and his chefs. Shane McCluskey was the key driver of these evenings and encouraged everyone to have fun.

All of these activities cannot succeed without volunteers and I thank each and every one of you for giving up your time to ensure that things run like clockwork. The volunteers will be recognised by the Mulgrave Country Club during May.

The Committee held a Special General Meeting in March to present and vote on the Bowls Committee restructure – a consideration that had been on the Committee's agenda for some time. After a lot of suggestions, deliberations, drafts and meetings, we finally put forward the motion to reduce the number of Committee members from 10 to 8 but with more active Sub Committees. It was great to see 54 of our members turn out to support the motion.

Our membership has had a slight increase in numbers which is encouraging to see. We have finished the year with 170 registered bowlers which saw 10 inward transfers and 5 outward plus 12 new bowlers commenced during the year. Our signs are good that we will continue to increase our numbers.

We are grateful to our two sponsors – Barry Plant Monash Real Estate and Keyton Retirement Villages in Rowville. Both have updated their signage around the greens while Keyton were our sponsors of a bowls tournament during March.

The greens staff headed up by Greens Director Stephen Staff and Green Keeper Michael DiMattia ensured that all greens were running at their best all season. The weather was kind right through to February and very little watering was required. The artificial green has been a blessing to the club allowing bowling all year.

He will be greatly missed when he retires from the committee this coming year. Overview

This season it was pleasing to be able to enter 7 full sides of 16 bowlers, an increase from the 5 full sides and 1 side of 12 that we entered in 2022-23.

This was done to ensure that all bowlers who registered to play weekend pennant got a regular game. This was achieved with the grateful help of our "emergency" bowlers who filled in when we were short. The selectors thank all who helped fill sides enabling Mulgrave CC to field full sides every week of the pennant competition.

Our main aims were to get side 2 promoted to Division 2 and maintain side 1 in Division 1, and for all weekend bowlers to enjoy their bowls, all of which were achieved.

<u>Side 1</u> were unlucky and missed playing finals by 1 point which was a great effort in a strong section.

<u>Side 2</u> finished second and defeated Hampton Park in the Section semi-final by 9 shots. They played Hampton Park again to win the **Section grand final** by 5 shots. They played a very strong Rosamond side in the Division quarter final and were unsuccessful but had a great season.

PROMOTED TO DIVISION 2.

<u>Side 3</u> had a hard job against many clubs' number 1 sides and unfortunately were relegated to Division 4.

<u>Side 4</u> Finished on top of the Section but lost the Section semi-final to Burden Park by 3 shots. They then played Narre Warren at home and won by 12 shots. The side then played Burden Park in the **Section grand final** and reversed the decision from the last game and won by 5 shots. The next assignment was to play Richmond Union in the Division quarter-final and after 84 ends scores were tied so an extra end was played by all four rinks with Mulgrave CC winning the **Division quarter final by 4 shots.** They then played Altona in the Division semi final but were unsuccessful. Overall, it was a great effort ending up being in the top 4 sides in a 64-side competition. **PROMOTED TO DIVISION 4.**

<u>Side 5</u> also had a good year finishing 5th only 4 points out of the 4.

<u>Side 6</u> Came from the clouds and finished 4th. They lost the section prelininary final with scores being tied after 84 ends by one shot in extra ends. A great effort, Congratulations.

<u>Side 7</u> had a difficult year with many changes to personnel during the year.

In summary we have had Sides 2 and 4 promoted and Side 3 relegated.

Next year the club will be eligible to have sides in Divisions 1,2,4,4,6, with 2 Sides in 7.

I am sure that with the synthetic green again allowing many bowlers to play and practice all winter, our skills will improve again and hopefully next season Mulgrave will be even better.

OVERVIEW OF SEASON 2022/2023

Midweek Pennant has come to an end with many highs and a few not so.

The 14-week season commenced on 24th October 2023 and after much debate and angst we sought to enter 8 sides of 12 players; however on further consideration this was amended to seven Sides ranging from Division 1 through to Division 6. We never had to forfeit due to lack of players so many thanks must go out to all the emergencies who helped us out when we were looking a little dicey with player numbers or when someone was forced to withdraw at the last minute. Without your help we would have had to forfeit games. Our heartfelt thanks to all of those bowlers who acted as Team Managers, Umpires, duty teams and the Controlling Body; without your contribution Pennant could not go ahead.

This Season's Midweek Selectors were comprised of returning selectors Pauline Coe, Graeme Cobbett, Don Matthews and Morris LePage; to this group were added new comers Les Amy and myself as Chair. At one of our early meetings Don indicated that he would not be able to continue in the role for personal health reasons.

We continued as a Committee of 5 for the remainder of the Season.

OVERALL RESULTS

At the end of the home and away season:

Side 1 (Division 1) after a very slow start to the Season rallied towards the end and climbed out of relegation territory to finish 5th in a very effective concluding few rounds.

Side 2 (Division 2) after being relegated last Season finished 4th and played Narre Warren 2 on their quite difficult carpet and could not get across the line on the day.

Side 3 (Division 2) finished 6th after a very tough Season and were able to avoid relegation by one solitary point and will remain in Division 2.

Side 4 (Division 3) finished 8th after a difficult Season where wins were hard to find although we were competitive in many matches. They will be relegated to Division 4.

Side 5 (Division 4) finished a very close 2nd after losing the last two Rounds. 2nd place meant an away game v Hampton Park 1 which they duly won to go directly to the Sectional Grand Final and promotion to Division 3. The next Tuesday they were again pitted against Hampton Park 1 at Noble

Mulgrave Country Club Park and came out Sectional Premiers with a 21 shot win, a great success. The side went on to defeat Ferntree Gully 2 at Division ¼ Finals only to lose the Semi to Deer Park 2. A super effort by all who contributed throughout the Season.

Side 6 (Division 5) finished 6th after struggling with many positional changes throughout the season and avoided possible Relegation with great wins in Rounds 11 & 12.

Side 7 (Division 6) finished 3rd after great wins in Rounds 12 & 13 with a bye in Round 14 and became the only Side with a Home Final. In the Section Semi-final they muscled up to Hampton Bayside 4 and won by a very impressive 16 shots to move into Thursday's Preliminary-final against Edithvale 3 and succumbed after a gallant fight. They however did achieve far above expectation given all the personnel changes they experienced through the Season.

We were also able to give many new bowlers a chance to play their first pennant games and thankfully avoided having to forfeit any games due to lack of players. Some really tight results and many Games that were within reach just eluded us, however with the perseverance and commitment demonstrated greater results could be on the cards in Season 2024-25. Congratulations to each and every bowler for your contribution this Season.

Next Season we should have Sides in Divisions 1, 2 (2 Sides) 3, 4, 5 and 6 provided we can field seven Sides again.

I take this opportunity to thank my team for supporting me during the season and for their hard work and commitment. Along with the Selection process itself Pauline and Graeme who organised the printing of the cards, labels and writing up the boards on Monday mornings. To Morris for collating the score and performance cards after pennant and Les for taking on the very onerous task of looking after our data entry both for our meetings and posting our Teams (often a number of times due to last minute changes). A lot of work goes on behind the scenes that many are not aware of, however we at Committee enjoy the task and the results of our hard work can be quite satisfying.

We must also give thanks to David West for his IT expertise. He was always available to guide us when we struggled with the computer work.

SUMMARY

In summary – this season included many highs and some disappointments, which as a cohesive Club we overcame, to pursue our sport in the best possible attitude.

We can now look forward to the 2024/2025 with hopes of even more success.

Midweek Triples

Products

Bowling Arms

The Hacksaw bowling arm was the overwhelming choice for members from other available brands of which 11 were purchased during the season.

Revenue from the sale of bowls product for this season was \$2493.50 Thanks to you all for your continuing support.

Some bowls products from Henselite were unavailable during the year but are now available and we currently have a full range of products for sale.

Several visiting bowlers commented on the way we had our trading table set up for our members and the prices of products were very reasonable.

If you require a product that you would like, and we do not have it in stock, please see me or one of the assistants and we will endeavour to get that product for you.

Clothing

Uniform

There was no restocking of bowls uniform required this season but sales of existing stock was \$2575.00.

Cancer council hats were extremely popular with 23 being sold to members.

Re-cycled Clothing

This was an overwhelming success for the club. Members who were no longer bowling or had joined other clubs were donating their clothing back to the club to be recycled.

All items were thoroughly inspected, cleaned etc prior to be placed on sale at much reduced prices.

The sales of recycled clothing topped \$772, of which \$392 went back to the members in the form of plates of chips after the last pennant days and prizes for the end of season function.

Sections Kitchen

For the majority of the pennant season some past bowlers provided the volunteer assistance required to serve the tea and coffee plus clean up.

For the financial Year ending March 31, 2024, the accounts controlled by Bowls Section posted a deficit of \$8,947 compared with the budgeted deficit of \$20,097. The result was over \$11,150 better than the budget and \$9,531 better than prior year's deficit of \$18,478. This result is a pleasing effort by Bowls members, helped greatly by a record Corporate Bowls income.

Bowls section continues to support its members, the community and activities in promoting the club through the following major activities:

- Sponsorship of Bowls Victoria Novice State Carnival
- Donation to the Jane McGrath Foundation
- Sponsoring prizes for the Easter Monday Tournament (open to all registered bowlers)
- Weekly 'Best Rink' prizes incentive to the members for Pennant games
- Promoting Sporting activity through Free Barefoot Bowls Events

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

INCOME

- 1. Corporate Bowls: An extremely successful year with over 1100 Corporate guests enjoying Bowls. Almost half the annual Bowls income is generated from this activity. Increased charge per head compared to budget.
- 2. Green Fees: For Hosting Pennant Finals as well as ERBR championship events on our Greens
- 3. *Merchandise Sales*: Supporting members with Bowls clothing and products. Increased sales with corresponding increase in purchases.
- 4. Raffles: All Raffle collections for Pink Day Tournament are donated to the Jane McGrath Foundation.
- 5. Sponsorship: Keyton Sponsorship (\$2000) was renewed this year but not budgeted.
- 6. Tournament Fees: Entry Fees Collected for Keyton (March 2024) and Easter Monday (April 2023) tournaments.

EXPENSES

- 7. Catering Costs: Tournaments Catering, Kitchen Supplies and BBQs etc
- 8. *Entry Fees*: Pennant Entry Fees to Bowls Vic (\$2396); ERBR Region Fees (\$1190); Green Fees for Pennant Finals played at other Clubs; and entry Fees for members playing in region, state and National championship events.
- 9. Players Subsidy: Allowance paid to bowlers or officials involved in prestigious events
- 10. *Trophy and Awards*: Sponsoring prizes for the Easter Monday Tournament (2023); Keyton Tournament 2024 (not budgeted for), Best Rink Vouchers for Pennant games and Club Championship Trophies.
- 11. Other Expenses: Novice sponsorship \$2000; Barefoot Advertising \$2,600 (flyers); Repairs and Maintenance; Bowls Vic Transfer Fees; Coaches and Umpires reaccreditation Fees and Other Sundry expenses
